The Committee will evaluate the inclination for scientific activity and the ability to organize the phases of the research autonomously and rationally.

In particular, the Committee will evaluate the following aspects of the project:

- B1 Knowledge of the state of the art in literature
- B2 Clarity, originality, and content of the research objectives
- B3 Appropriateness and quality of the research methodologies
- B4 Feasibility of the project
- B5 Relevance to the educational and scientific objectives of the PhD program

Minimum score for access to the oral exam on points A-B: 40/60

C - Interview (max 60 points)

During the oral examination, the Examining Committee will further evaluate the qualifications, the scientific validity of the research project, and the candidates' motivation for scientific research. The Committee will also assess the candidates' level of English language knowledge.

Oral exam criteria:

- C1 Knowledge of the main themes of Political Economy (microeconomics, macroeconomics, and econometrics)
- C2 Knowledge of the reference literature for the presented scientific research project
- C3 Expository clarity, logical abilities, appropriate use of scientific terminology
- C4 Motivations for scientific research and commitment to complete the doctoral cycle

Passing the oral exam requires a minimum score of 40/60.

To be admitted to the PhD course, candidates must obtain a minimum overall score of 80/120 points.
