

Evaluation criteria for the admission to the PhD programme in Heritage Science (40th cycle)

The titles will be evaluated on the basis of the following evaluation grid:

Titles (max 80 points)

Students who will defend their thesis before the date established for the evaluation of qualifications are required to communicate to the PhD Programme Coordinator or to the President of the Commission the grade obtained in their degree, while for those who will defend the thesis after the date established for the evaluation of qualifications, but before October 31, 2024, the grid in point 1 is replaced by the following:

4 – Research project (max 60 points)

For the purposes of selection for the PhD programme, the candidate must submit a project that can be used to assess the candidate's propensity for research and his ability to organise the various stages of the project independently, which must not exceed a maximum length of 15000 characters (including spaces). This project, submitted for the purposes of the competition, does not constitute an obligation for admitted candidates to carry out research activities during their PhD, subject to the assessment and approval of the Board of Lecturers..

In particular, there will be evaluated:

- Knowledge of the state of the art (10 points)
- Innovative aspects of the project (15 points)
- Clarity and completeness of the presentation of objectives, methodologies, and potential results (10 points)
- Feasibility of the project (15 points)
- Relevance of the project to the educational objectives of the PhD programme (10 points)

N.B. The sum of points 1, 2, 3, and 4 must be equal to the overall sum of Qualifications.

Candidates who have obtained at least 50 points in the overall assessment of qualifications are eligible for the next test
