

## Evaluation criteria for the admission exam to the PhD in Philology and History of the Ancient World (40th cycle)

Assessment of qualifications and oral test will be merged.

Qualifications will be assessed according to the following evaluation grid:

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### 3 - Research experiences (**max 2 points**)

### 4 – Research project (**max 9 points**)

For the purposes of selection for the PhD programme, the candidate must submit a project that can be used to assess the candidate's propensity for research and his ability to organise the various stages of the project independently, which must not exceed a maximum length of 8000 characters (including spaces). In particolare verranno valutati:

- State of the art knowledge (1,5 points)
- Originality and innovative content (4 points)
- Clarity and completeness of presentation of objectives, methodologies and potential outcomes; feasibility (2 points)
- Relevance of the project to the PhD educational objectives (1,5 points)

The oral test will be assessed according to the following evaluation grid:

#### **Oral test (max 25 points)**

During the oral test, aspects relating to the qualifications submitted, the written paper and/or the project will be discussed and clarified, the scores being distributed as follows:

- Discussion of topics related to the research project (15 points);
- Discussion of the candidate's paper and titles: clarity of presentation, ability to synthesise and scientific interest of the CV (7 points);
- foreign language (3 points).

**Candidates should score at least 20 points in the overall assessment of qualifications and oral test.**
