

Evaluation criteria for the admission to the PhD course Joint International Doctorate in Social Representations, Culture and Communication 40th cycle

Motivation Letter

The motivation letter, maximum 5000 characters including spaces, should clarify the applicant's objectives and motivation in pursuing an international joint doctorate, as well as clarify scientific motivations behind the choice of home institution indicated in the application.

The motivation letter is compulsory, but it won't receive any mark.

It will be considered and discussed during the oral interview.

Interview (max 40 points)

Candidates who obtain an evaluation of at least 36/60 in the assessment of their curriculum and research project will be admitted to the interview

The interview has the aim of evaluating:

- the background of competences and skills related with the themes and approaches of the doctorate (max 20 points)
- motivations, research interest, methodological competences and research attitudes will be discussed also with respect to the proposed research, motivation letter and previous experiences (max 20 points)

The minimum resulting score valid for the interview is 24/40

The minimum final resulting score valid for the admission is 60/100
