I International Conference for Emerging Researchers in Philosophy and Language Sciences (PhiLanSci UAM 2025)

Dear Doctoral Students,

On the **27th, 28th, and 29th of May 2025**, the I International Conference for Emerging Researchers in Philosophy and Language Sciences (PhiLanSci UAM 2025), will be held at the Lecture Hall of the Faculty of Philosophy and Arts of the Universidad Autónoma de Madrid (UAM).

This first year, we will have Portugal as the guest country, and we will be able to enjoy the inspiring interventions of internationally recognized professors Henrique Leitão and Antonio Branco from the University of Lisbon, as well as Javier Órdoñez from UAM, among other important guests, such as Professors Filipa Maria Valido-Viegas, Elena Garayzábat and Yuko Morimoto .

This first international conference represents an evolution of the successful VIII Jornadas de Jóvenes Investigadores en Filosofía y Ciencias del Lenguaje UAM 2024, which allowed us to consider internationalizing the event in order to establish a broader and stronger network between doctoral students from around the world and to increase the visibility and reach of the UAM's Philosophy and Language Sciences Doctoral Program.

This new meeting continues to promote communication within an interdisciplinary space where emerging researchers can present the processes or some of the results of their ongoing research and receive constructive feedback from other researchers. We aim to create an international forum for sharing reflections and projects with other colleagues, fostering an enriching dialogue that connects different perspectives and approaches to research and dissemination of results.

This call is addressed to doctoral students enrolled in the Philosophy and Language Sciences Doctoral Program at UAM, and it is extended to communications and posters from colleagues at universities in the Madrid region, throughout Spain, and from universities around the world that are part of similar programs. We eagerly await your contributions.

The event will have a hybrid format: in-person for doctoral students from universities in the Madrid region, and online for international participants and Spanish attendees from universities outside the Madrid region who are unable, or do not wish, to travel. The event will be open to the interested public, not just specialists, as one of the premises of this conference is to promote an open and engaging approach to Humanities and Science. For this reason, we will value the effort in presenting written work in a professional, yet engaging and approachable manner.

Participants who are enrolled in Bachelor's, Master's, or Doctoral Programs and wish to request a certificate of attendance will receive it, provided they sign the attendance sheet for at least a day and a half or attend three out of the six sessions during the three days of the event. Speakers and poster authors must also attend at least two out of the six sessions **to receive the speaker certificate** (i.e., their full presentation day, or their presentation session plus another session on any day), and, like all other participants, whether in-person or online, must attend a minimum of three sessions **to receive an additional attendance certificate**

During all days the event will be held from 10:00 AM to 2:00 PM (with a break at 12:00 PM) and from 3:30 PM to 7:00 PM, with a break at 5:00 PM (UTC+1).

PROPOSALS

Communications will last approximately **10 to 15** minutes, followed by a brief Q&A session. As it is an international conference, presentations in both English and Spanish are accepted. A translation service to English will be available for international attendees.

POSTERS

Posters are also accepted and expected. These will be displayed in the Lecture Hall of the Faculty during the three days of the conference. Participants are responsible for the printing and shipping of their posters. Size for the poster: **DIN A1** (approximately 59.4 x 84.1 cm) in **vertical format**. Participants in this modality will receive a certificate of participation under the same conditions as speakers and attendees. In no case will the poster be mailed back, but it can be collected in person on the last day of the conference.

The presentations and posters submitted must be related to one of the following research areas and courses:

- Linguistics Applied to the Acquisition and Learning of Modern and Classical Languages
- Interdisciplinary Studies of Language and Discourse
- Philological studies

Proposals for communications must be sent as a Word document before the **30th of April** through the event's website www.philansci.es, where a specific submission mailbox will be enabled, or (exclusively if there is any issue with the website) via email to philansci.confe@uam.es. **(Only communications from institutional emails will be attended to)** The research field to which the work or poster belongs must be clearly stated, along with the **title and abstract** (min. 600 max. 800 words + basic bibliography) **and an academic profile of no more than five lines**. After evaluating the submitted material, the selected proposals will be corresponded by the **10th of May**, allowing enough time to organize the schedule and prepare the interventions.
