I am a Roman anthropologist. My area of specialization is Anthropology of Religions and Political Anthropology. I am interested in the relationship between the environment and human/non-human beings with their culturally differentiated perceptions, centred on the active body and its emotions. My current field of research (since 2023) is in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, where I work with Afro-Brazilian religious practices. Specifically, for the doctoral research project, the ethnographic analysis aims to investigate the construction of relationships and conflicts of ciganas spiritualities within the Brazilian mediumship practices of Umbanda and Vale do Amanhecer. Education and mediation, especially intercultural mediation, are the other two fundamental aspects that I have tried to develop in my experiences. Through curricular, extracurricular, professional and volunteer practices, I have developed excellent interpersonal, organisational and management skills, in groups and autonomously, always involving the body in dialogue and listening.

RHEAL explores innovative interdisciplinary methods to promote collaboration between researchers, health care providers, religious and traditional healers, people with lived experience of mental health and their carers. Through an interdisciplinary approach combining anthropology, creative arts, sociology, psychology and psychiatry, the project addresses key issues in mental health with the aim of facilitating dialogue between different therapeutic approaches and improving the quality of care and knowledge exchange. Focusing specifically on mental health,

trance and possession phenomena, RHEAL aims to bridge the epistemological gap between biomedical and religious, spiritual and traditional perspectives by identifying best practices for collaborative healing.

To achieve these aims, RHEAL uses ethnographic, micro-phenomenological methods and creative participatory approaches to develop co-designed, person-centred models of knowledge transfer. Visual arts and multimodal approaches - including participatory video, photography and sensory engagement - provide access to lived and embedded experiences of healing, rethinking knowledge production about collaborative healing through sensory interaction in everyday life with materialities and images to promote inclusive, sustainable and collaborative policies. Integrating the human, life and social sciences, RHEAL aims to create an interdisciplinary and applied methodological toolkit for mental health research and practice. By promoting innovative collaborative practices, the project aims to contribute to inclusive and sustainable health policies and to the global discourse on integrative healing. Under the concept of sustainability, RHEAL aims to create systems that are able to integrate people's experiences and traditional knowledge, and to welcome different epistemologies and therapeutic approaches side by side.
